### CAREER SERVICES OFFICE

Through various support and coop programs, our Career Services office helps students prepare for employment. Our advisers will help you choose and build your career, make contacts with potential employers, and assist in finding co-op placement.

### CONSISTENT WITH RIT

All students participate in our co-op program, created and aligned with RIT's Cooperative Education program, one of the oldest and widespread cooperative education programs in the world. Students of Web and Mobile Computing / Information Technology and International Business complete their co-op programs after their sophomore and junior years (a minimum of 800 hours), while students of Hospitality and Tourism Management complete their coop programs in their freshman, sophomore and junior years (a minimum of 1,200 hours). Co-op experiences include placement in companies in Croatia and worldwide and cover areas relevant to our students' programs of study.

# Earn a valuable scolarship

In order to support qualified students in financing their studies, RIT Croatia has secured over € 350,000 for scholarships and financial aid for enrollment in the 2020/2021 academic year. Your education is a wise investment in your future. Through high-quality academic programs and the benefits of a prestigious American diploma, RIT Croatia offers an excellent return on that investment.

SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL AID
RIT Croatia has secured over € 350,000 for

scholarships and financial aid that will be awarded to freshmen in the 2020/2021 academic year. Scholarships and financial aid are nonrefundable monetary funds applied towards the tuition cost of attending RIT Croatia over four years of study. Scholarships can be applied to the following undergraduate programs: Hospitality and Tourism Management, International Business, and Web and Mobile Computing / Information Technology. Seventy percent of last year's applicants that had applied for financial aid were awarded RIT Croatia scholarships and financial aid; your chances of getting a scholarship are high!

### FINANCIAL AID

Financial aid is awarded in the amount of  $\in$  1,000 to  $\in$  10,000. The amount awarded is deducted from the student's total annual tuition amount. The total amount of financial aid granted is divided into four years of study. Candidates who apply by February 15, 2020, will be given priority consideration for financial aid. Applications received after February 15 will be considered for financial aid if remaining funds are available.

### SELECTION CRITERIA

Financial aid is awarded to students according to the following criteria: financial need (estimated income of parents/guardians and the number of household members), the motivation for studying at RIT Croatia (assessed through the motivational essay/motivational interview), and academic achievements during high school and/or entrance exam results.

### WHO CAN APPLY?

Eligible students are all senior high school students,

students who wish to transfer from other universities (transfer students), and candidates who finished high school in the previous years.

### SCHOLARSHIPS

Unlike other financial aid, which is granted based on success and the financial needs of the candidates, scholarships are granted exclusively based on the level of success achieved in the scholarship contests organized by RIT Croatia. All candidates who completed their first three years of high school with a GPA of 4.5 out of 5.0 (or 3.5 out of 4.0 or higher according to the U.S. grading scale), will be offered immediate scholarships in the amount of  $\in$  4,000 after they are accepted to one of the RIT Croatia programs. The award is conditional upon completing the fourth year with a GPA of 4.5 or higher.

Throughout the academic year, several scholarship contests are announced on our website and on our Facebook page. Interested applicants can participate in the contest and win valuable scholarships.
